Trick-Or-Treating Safety Tips

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Halloween Safety

- H** Hold a flashlight while trick-or-treating to help you see and others see you. Make sure you walk and not run from house to house.
- A** Always test make-up in a small area first. Remove it before bedtime to prevent possible skin and eye irritation.
- L** Look both ways before crossing the street. Use established crosswalks.
- L** Lower your risk for serious eye injury by not wearing decorative contact lenses.
- O** Only walk on sidewalks. If not possible, walk along the far edge of the road facing traffic.
- W** Wear well-fitting masks, costumes, and shoes to avoid blocked vision, trips, and falls.
- E** Eat only factory-wrapped treats. Avoid eating homemade treats made by strangers.
- E** Enter homes only if you're with a trusted adult. Only visit well-lit houses. Don't stop at dark houses. Never accept rides from strangers.
- N** Never walk near lit candles or luminaries. Be sure to wear flame resistant costumes.

To ensure Trick-or-Treaters, you, and your house stay safe, remember the following tips.

- Children should never take shortcuts through backyards, alleys, or parks.
- Do not leave your home unattended on Halloween night.
- Keep your house well lit, both inside and out.
- Be sure your pets are secured.
- Never invite children into your home.
- Clear your yard and sidewalk of any obstacles or decorations that may be hard to see in the dark.
- Report any suspicious or criminal activity to the police department.

CANDY CHECK



Make sure to remove any candy that isn't packaged or may present a choking hazard (such as peanuts or small hazard candies).

To save yourself time when you first get home and kids want to dig into their stash, bring along a second bag to deposit "safe" candy—treats from houses of people that you know well.

Immediately toss any items that are suspect in any way. Notify the police if harmful items are found.
